In today's Gospel Jesus and the religious leaders in Jerusalem continue their tense exchange of questions and challenges. At this point the disciples of the Pharisees, together with the Herodians, try to entrap Jesus by their question about the payment of taxes.

Matthew sets up an unusual partnership between the Pharisees and the Herodians. The Herodians were supporters of Herod Antipas, a Jewish political leader who collaborated with the Romans. Such collaboration

would have required a compromised observance of the Mosaic Law. The Pharisees, on the other hand, taught scrupulous observance of the Mosaic Law and opposed Roman occupation. Herodians favored the payment of taxes; the Pharisees opposed it. The Herodians and the Pharisees approach Jesus, asking that he take sides in their dispute. If Jesus answers with the Pharisees, he shows himself to be an enemy of Rome. If he answers with the Herodians, he offends popular Jewish religious sensibilities.

Jesus' response to this attempt to trap him exposes the guile of his questioners. From his first words to them, Jesus shows that he is very much aware of what they are trying to do. He asks to see a Roman coin, which is readily provided to him. It may have come from the hand of a Herodian, but the Pharisees show themselves to be quite willing to accept this compromise. Jesus has already exposed the Pharisees as hypocrites.

Jesus takes his response one step further. He asks that his questioners examine the coin. Agreeing that it is Caesar's image on the coin, Jesus tells them that it must belong to Caesar. Avoiding the question of lawfulness altogether, Jesus answers their question with simple logic. Then, going further still, Jesus tells them that their obligation is to pay to God that which belongs to God.

Jesus' response to the Herodians and Pharisees suggests the ethic that Christians ought to adopt. It reminds us of the importance of keeping things in their proper perspective. Do we attach ourselves to worldly things at the expense of the love and honor that we owe to God? (loyolapress.com) +R.R.

Consular Mission in Toronto on 11-12 November 2023

The consular mission will be held at Prisikėlimo parapija (Church of the Resurrection) 1 Resurrection Rd Toronto, ON., M9A 5G1. Consular services will be provided from 09 am to 1 pm. and from 2 pm to 6 p.m. Only persons who have completed their registration and received confirmation of registration will be served during the consular mission. Registration for admission must be completed until November 3 at electronic registration system - <u>https://keliauk.urm.lt/</u> consult-registration

When registering, please select the visit type Consular Mission, then proceed to select Registration for Reception during the Consular Mission *in Toronto*. When registering, please mention in the comments section the services you wish to receive, the full names (as shown on the ID), date of birth and of the persons who will receive consular services. When registering for more than one service, please reserve two visit times. Single visit time would be enough if a single party is applying for issuance of two passports.

During consular missions, the fee for consular services is increased by 50%. (consular fee amounts are published <u>here</u>). Only debit/credit cards and Interac e-transfers will be accepted during the mission.

Pope: St. Charles de Foucauld 'let Jesus act silently'

At the weekly General Audience, Pope Francis continues his catechesis series on apostolic zeal, and reflects on the joyful witness borne in the Sahara Desert by St. Charles de Foucauld.



Pope Francis picked up his catechesis series on various exemplars of apostolic zeal at the Wednesday General Audience, focusing on Saint Charles de Foucauld. Born in Strasbourg in 1858, St. Charles served as a soldier in the French army before becoming a hermit and Catholic priest among the Tuareg people in Algeria, where he was assassinated in 1916.

The Pope said the saint made Jesus and his poorest brothers and sisters "the passion of his life". After his conversion, St. Charles wrote to a non-believing friend that he had "lost his heart to Jesus of Nazareth."

Pope Francis said his words show that the first step in evangelizing is "to have Jesus at the centre of one's heart." "If this does not happen, we can hardly show it with our lives," he said. "Instead, we risk talking about ourselves, our group, a morality or, even worse, a set of rules, but not about Jesus, His love, His mercy."

Crying out Gospel in silence - The Pope noted that St. Charles de Foucauld moved from "attraction to Jesus to imitation of Jesus," and even felt like a younger brother to the Lord. He went so far as to move to the most remote of places—the Sahara Desert to live among the Taureg people—to "cry out the Gospel in silence." "Charles let Jesus act silently, convinced that the 'Eucharistic life' evangelizes," he said. "Indeed, he believed that Christ is the first evangelizer."

The saint spent up to 12 hours a day in prayer before the Tabernacle, trusting Jesus to carry out the work of evangelization.

Apostolate of meekness - Pope Francis went on to say that St. Charles foreshadowed the Second Vatican Council by emphasizing the evangelizing mission of the laity. He wrote that "every Christian is an apostle" and that priests need to have lay people close to them who can "evangelize with the closeness of charity".

The Pope invited Christians to take up that call to evangelization "by kneeling and welcoming the action of the Spirit". St. Charles, he added, communicated the beauty of the Gospel through "the apostolate of meekness" and in his desire to be a "universal brother" to everyone.

"Gradually these bonds generated fraternity, inclusion, appreciation of the other's culture," said Pope Francis. "Goodness is simple and asks us to be simple people, who are not afraid to offer a smile."

Christian joy as charity - In conclusion, Pope Francis invited everyone live with "with Christian joy, Christian meekness, Christian tenderness, Christian compassion, and Christian closeness.

The Holy Father noted, "With the smile, with his simplicity Brother Charles bore witness to the Gospel. Never proselytism, never: witness. Evangelization is never done through proselytism, but through witness, through attraction." The Parish is not responsible for the content of the ads

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
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
