Today's Gospel reading describes how Jesus calms a storm at sea. It is the first of four miracles that are presented in sequence at this point in Mark's Gospel.

As is typical in Mark's Gospel, Jesus' disciples are frightened by the sudden storm; they do little to inspire confidence in the reader. Mark notes the contrast between the disciples' terror and Jesus' peace. Jesus is sleeping, untroubled by what is going on around him.

The disciples' words to Jesus are telling. They are familiar enough with Jesus to dare to wake him. Their words to him are words of reproach, questioning his care for them. A careful reader might wonder what the disciples expected Jesus to do. Are they more troubled by the storm or by Jesus' inattentiveness to their needs? How many of us have chided a family member or friend for not agreeing with our assessment of the severity of a situation?

Today's Gospel offers evidence of Jesus' power and authority as he calms the storm. In his day, power over nature was believed to be a sign of divinity—only God calms storms. Jesus' rebuke of the storm also echoes the rebuke he uses when he talks to and expels demons. In each situation, Jesus' power and authority is a sign of his divinity. Indeed, the disciples are left wondering about Jesus' identity at the conclusion of today's Gospel. They see before them a human being who acts with the authority and power of God. The disciples' uncertainty about Jesus' identity is a recurring them in Mark's Gospel.

This Gospel is a metaphor for our lives. We are in the boat, the storms of life are raging around us, and like the disciples, we may believe that Jesus is unconcerned, or "sleeping." We hope that we will be as familiar with Jesus as his disciples. If we feel that Jesus is sleeping, are we comfortable enough to wake Jesus and present him with our needs? Jesus does not chide his disciples for waking him. Instead he chides them for their lack of faith, for their lack of perspective. When we bring our worries to God in prayer, we might just begin to learn to see things from God's perspective. (loyolapress.com)

Dear parishioners,

The imposition of COVID 19 restrictions on churches by the Ontario provincial government remains. All previous precautions remain in effect to ensure the health and safety of all:

- *If you are experiencing symptoms, please stay home

- *Disinfect your hands and wear a face covering while you are in church
- *Always maintain a safe distance of 2m. from others

The maximum number of Mass participants is currently limited, including priests and those participating in music ministry. As a result, we are temporarily implementing a mandatory registration system for Sunday Masses.

We regret that we may not be able to accommodate everyone who wishes to attend Mass in person. We will only be able to accommodate Mass participants who have pre-registered, and we ask for your patience and understanding.

*If you register and then realize you will not be able to attend, please cancel your registration to free up the spot for someone else.



Pope at Audience: On the Cross,

Jesus prayed for each of us At the General Audience on Wednesday, Pope Francis concludes a long series of catechetical lessons on "prayer," focusing on the



priestly prayer of Jesus.

As he concluded his catechetical cycle on prayer - which began over a year ago, in May 2020 - Pope Francis said "the most beautiful thing to remember" is "the grace that we do not only pray, but that, so to speak, we have been 'prayed for,' we have already been received in Jesus's dialogue with the Father, in communion with the Holy Spirit."

Prayer, the Pope said, "is one of the most evident features in Jesus' life... because the dialogue with the Father was the incandescent core of His

whole existence."

Core of Christian proclamation - Although Jesus prayed throughout His earthly life, said the Pope, His prayer became even more intense in the days and hours leading to His Passion and Death, the "central core" of the Christian proclamation, which shed light on the whole of Jesus' life.

Jesus "was not a philanthropist who took care of human suffering and illness: He was and is much more," the Pope said. Jesus offers us "total salvation, messianic salvation, that gives hope in

the definitive victory of life over death."

And so, Pope Francis added, "in the last days of His final Passover, we find Jesus fully emersed in prayer": In the agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, where He confidently addressed

of Gethsemane, where He confidently addressed God as 'Abba,' Father, a word expressing intimacy and trust; and on the Cross, "obscurely shrouded in the silence of God," where once again He calls on God the Father.

Cross fulfills Father's gift - On the Cross, said Pope Francis, "the gift of the Father is accomplished — who offers love. That is, our salvation is accomplished." When Jesus cried out to God on the Cross, saying, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit," the Pope explained, He offered "everything. Everything is prayer, in the three hours of the Cross."

Jesus' prayer, the Pope said, "is intense, the

Jesus' prayer, the Pope said, "is intense, the prayer of Jesus is unique and also becomes the model for our prayer." Pope Francis insisted, "Jesus prayed for everyone, He also prayed for me, for each one of you. Each one of us can say: 'Jesus prayed for me on the Cross.' He prayed. Jesus can say to each one of us: 'I prayed for you, at the Last Supper, and on the wood of the Cross.'"

We are never alone - Pope Francis said we must "keep this in our heart, we must never forget" that Jesus prayed for each of us personally. "We were willed by Jesu Christ, and even in the our

of His Passion, Death, and Resurrection, everything was offered for us."

So, the Pope concluded, "with prayer and with life, all that is left for us is to have courage, hope, and with this courage and hope to experience strongly the prayer of Jesus and go forward: so that our life might give glory to God in the awareness that He prays for me to the Father, that Jesus prays for me."
