PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION - B

This Sunday, called Palm or Passion Sunday, is the first day of Holy Week. Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday are called the Triduum—three days that are the highlight of the Church vear.

In Mark's Gospel, Jesus' passion and death are presented as the consequence of the tension between the Jewish authorities and Jesus that been building throughout his public ministry. This tension reached its breaking point when Jesus drove the merchants and moneychangers from the Temple. After this event, the chief priests and scribes began seeking a way to put Jesus to death, and yet, this is only the surface explanation for his death.

When Jesus was arrested and brought before the Sanhedrin—the council of Jewish priests, scribes, and elders—he was charged with blasphemy, citing his threat to the Temple. When he was brought before Pilate, however, the religious authorities presented his crime as a political one, charging that Jesus claimed to be king of the Jews.

Throughout this Gospel, Mark challenges the reader to consider the claim with which the Gospel begins: Jesus is the Son of God. When we read Mark's account of the passion, we begin to comprehend the deeper theological statement being made about Jesus' death. In Mark's telling of the passion narrative, Jesus understood his death to have been preordained, and he accepted this death in obedience to God's will. Jewish Scripture is quoted only once, but there are several references to the fulfillment of the Scriptures. Jesus understood his anointing in Bethany as an anticipation of his burial, and he announced that this story would be told together with the Gospel throughout the world. Jesus predicted his betrayal by Judas as well as Peter's denial. At his arrest, Jesus acknowledged that the preordained time had arrived. Jesus was both confident and silent before his accusers. After he was sentenced to death, Jesus did not speak again until his final cry from the cross. The bystanders misunderstood and believed that he was calling for Elijah. The Roman centurion, however, affirmed what Mark has presented throughout this Gospel: Jesus is the Son of God. Nowhere was this revealed more fully than in his death on the cross.

During Holy Week, we prayerfully remember the events of Jesus' passion and death. As we meditate on the cross, we ask again and anew what it means to make the statement of faith that Jesus, in his obedient suffering and dying, revealed himself to us as God's Son. †R.R.

Registration for the elections and the referendum is compulsory, even if you have registered for the previous elections. Those planning to vote in Toronto (polling station will be set only for May 12) should choose "will vote at the embassy in Ottawa" and for the rest of elections – ", will vote by post".

Pope at Audience:

Virtue of prudence leads us toward holiness

During his Wednesday General Audience, Pope Francis continues his catechetical series on virtues and vices, turning to the virtue of prudence and saying Jesus urges to be prudent in order to become "intelligent saints."



Jesus does not only want us to become saints, but "intelligent" ones, and exercising the virtue of prudence helps us become so.

Pope Francis made this point during his weekly General Audience on Wednesday morning in the Vatican.

At the start of Audience, the Holy Father explained he would have an assistant, Father Pierluigi Giroli from the Vatican Secretariat of State, read for him.

Cardinal virtue of prudence - This week, the Pope continued his catechetical series on vices and virtues. After a number of months dedicated to the vices, he transitioned last week to a discussion of virtue, and this week, he individuated the virtue of prudence.

Prudence, the Pope recalled, is one of the four cardinal virtues that, together with the theological virtues of faith, hope, and charity, "are the pillars of integrated Christian living." Jesus often encouraged His disciples to exercise this virtue, Pope Francis highlighted, especially in His Parables.

Prudence, the Pope said, is "not the virtue of the timorous person, always hesitant about what action to take," nor is it "merely caution."

Rather, prudence, he clarified, "means that the action of man is in the hands of his intelligence and freedom."

'Right reason in action' - The virtue, said the Holy Father, effectively combines intelligence and creativity, helping us understand the complexity of situations and carefully evaluate possible solutions.

Suggesting it applies wisdom generated from past experiences while anticipating future needs, the Pope recalled that Doctor of the Church, Saint Thomas Aguinas, called prudence "right reason in action."

"That is not to say they do not make mistakes," the Holy Father acknowledged. "We are all human," he added, "but at least they avoid major setbacks."

Intelligent saints - The Holy Father illustrated passages of the Gospel that "help educate us" in prudence, including "the prudent man builds his house on the rock, and the imprudent builds his on sand," in the Gospel reading according to St. Matthew.

"Preparing His disciples for the mission," the Pope recalled, "Jesus recommends: 'Behold, I send you out as sheep in the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves' (Mt 10:16)."

While suggesting that the Lord's words are "as if to say, that God does not only want us to be saints. He wants us to be intelligent saints," Pope Francis concluded by encouraging the faithful to practice prudence daily as we journey toward Heaven.


