# CHURCH of the RESURRECTION NEWS Nr. 10 (3590) March 9th, 2025 1st SUNDAY OF LENT - C





In each of the three Synoptic Gospels, after his baptism, Jesus is reported to have spent forty days in the desert, fasting and praying. In Luke and in Matthew, the devil presents three temptations to Jesus. The devil tempts Jesus to use his power to appease his hunger, he offers Jesus all the kingdoms of the world if Jesus will worship him, and he tempts Jesus to put God's promise of protection to the test. In each case, Jesus resists, citing words from Scripture to rebuke the devil's temptation.

Each temptation that Jesus faces offers insight into the spirituality we hope to develop as we keep the forty days of the Season of Lent. We can trust God to provide for our material needs. We worship God because God alone has dominion over us and our world. We can trust God to be faithful to his promises. Jesus' rejection of the devil's temptations shows that he will not put God to the test. Grounding himself on the Word and authority of Scripture, Jesus rebukes the devil by his confidence in God's protection and faithfulness.

This Gospel highlights for us one of the central themes of the Season of Lent. We are dependent upon God for all that we have and all that we are. Anything that leads us to reject this dependency or to distrust its sufficiency, is a temptation from the devil.

Luke ends his report of Jesus' temptation in the desert by noting that the devil departs for a time. The implication is that the devil will return. Jesus knows that he will be tempted again in the Garden of Gethsemane. The depth of Jesus' trust in God is shown most fully when Jesus rejects the temptation to turn away from the task God has given to him. Jesus' final rebuke of the devil is his sacrifice on the Cross.

Jesus' responses to the temptations of the devil teach us how we can respond to temptation. As we start our journey through Lent, this Sunday's Gospel calls us to adopt the same confidence that Jesus had in the face of temptation: God's word alone will suffice, God's promise of protection can be trusted, and God alone is God. Lent is a forty-day period dedicated to preparing for the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ— Easter. Lent begins on Ash

Wednesday and ends with the start of the Mass of the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday.

However, it's more than just 40 days. Each Sunday is set aside to celebrate Christ's resurrection, so even though it has a specific character and the colour violet, it is not solely a time of penance or fasting. To preserve the fortyday period, Lent was moved to begin on Ash Wednesday, the Wednesday before the first Sunday of Lent.

#### What is the meaning of Lent?

**Lent** is like a time of universal Church retreat, a period of reflection and repentance during which believers are encouraged to contemplate the mystery of Christ, draw strength from it, cleanse their hearts, review their Christian lives, and prepare for the celebration of Christ's resurrection with a spirit of repentance and reconciliation. It is a time when the Lord calls us to return to Him and awaits our response.

Lent is marked by Jesus' call: "The time has come; the kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the gospel!" (Mark 1:15). Our response to this call depends on us. For Christians, Lent is a forty-day retreat into the desert—not a solitary wandering, but a shared experience of trial and purification with Jesus. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church (ccc) 540 reminds us, "The temptation of Jesus shows that the Son of God is not the Messiah that Satan proposes to Him and that people expect (cf. Mt 16:21-23). Thus, Christ overcame the tempter for our sake: 'For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin'" (Hebrews 4:15). Each year, the Church unites itself with the mystery of Jesus in the desert during these forty days of Lent. In summary, Lent is a deeper immersion into the depths of the mystery of our Lord Jesus Christ.
