3rd SUNDAY OF ADVENT - C



This Sunday's Gospel continues last week's focus on John the Baptist and his role in preparing the way for Christ. If we were to read Luke's Gospel continuously, we would learn about John the Baptist challenging the crowds who came to him and calling upon them to show evidence of their repentance.

Repentance, rather, must be observable in one's actions. Here, Luke is continuing to set up two important themes of his Gospel

message: the Christian faith is expressed in one's actions, and the call to salvation is extended to everyone, Jews and Gentiles.

In today's Gospel reading, the crowds ask John the Baptist for specifics. What evidence of repentance is required? John replies by naming concrete actions: crowds should share their food and cloaks; tax collectors should be just; soldiers should act fairly. The concern for justice is a hallmark of Luke's Gospel.

When the crowd begins to wonder if John the Baptist might be the Messiah, John interprets his baptism and makes it clear that his ministry is in preparation for the Messiah. John the Baptist knows his place and role in God's plan of salvation. By encouraging the crowd to act similarly in accordance with their stations in life, John's teaching suggests that each person has a role to play in God's salvation. It is the great mystery of our salvation that God permits and even asks for human cooperation in his divine plans.

The third Sunday of Advent is also called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is a Latin word that means "rejoice." This name is taken from the entrance antiphon for Sunday's Mass, which is also echoed in today's second reading from the Paul's letter to the Philippians. Some people mark this Sunday by lighting a pink candle instead of a purple one on their Advent wreath. It is a reminder that the Advent season is a season of joy because our salvation is already at hand. (loyolapress.com)

IN MEMORIAM: IRENA VIBRYS

Irena Vibrys, our dear Irute, is no longer with us in wintery Toronto. She used to say to me and my sister: "I'm your stepmother," and even signed her letters and holiday greetings as "Stepmother." She was too modest to say, "I'm your mother," although she often acted, spoke, and felt like a

mother—not only toward us but also in her interactions with parishioners and through her various efforts for the parish and Lithuania.

We met exactly 30 years ago when I first arrived in Toronto. I remember us transporting used furniture to College Street that her former workplace had donated to charity. Irena wondered if it might come in handy for the parish, and of course, it did. I received a massive desk at that time, on which I wrote hundreds of sermons over the next two and a half years. Irena didn't know I was a Franciscan friar preparing for the priesthood. She made some witty comment about my long hair and earring, to which I quipped back that Canada was a free country. That's how our friendship began.

Six months later, as I prepared for my ordination, she went above and beyond to help. The white priestly garment, the alb, which I still wear at Mass after all these years, was chosen and gifted by Irena. I think it will last me for the rest of my life.

We spent many warm and memorable evenings on the balcony of her home on Quebec Avenue, often with her best friend and neighbour, Grazina Balciunas. The two were very alike. Thankfully, Father Augustinas was a tolerant man and never said a word about my late-night outings. Irena loved to host, give, and bring joy. She enjoyed company, always cheerful and helpful. You'd never guess that she had endured so much hardship, worked tirelessly, and faced painful family problems. She constantly sought ways to do good for others.

I recall how she even went to Kenya, found a struggling family, and provided for them. She led Toronto's Catholic Women's group for many years. After every Sunday Mass, she and other women would sit with their homemade baked goods, collecting cent by cent to send support to Lithuania. If you praised her, she'd respond with a joke, without a trace of self-importance or pride.

When conversations turned to Lithuania and her childhood in the Pakruojis region, she'd recite lines from Vytė Nemunėlis:

There in the forest, where the fir trees rustle,
Under an old, old pine, Lived a bear, Rudnosis,
And his wife, Rudnosis. They had a little cub, Rudnosis,
just like them. He was still without trousers
And ran around only at home.

She remembered it word for word! I found it astonishing that a childhood memory could endure so vividly for so many years. From those childhood memories secretly arose many beautiful and important things. Even her faith and dedication to the Church were rooted in her Pakruojis upbringing.

We bid farewell to Irena during Advent, a fitting moment. It's the season of waiting for the Lord, yearning for heaven, and searching for paths toward God's Kingdom. These were deeply meaningful to Irena, even if she rarely spoke of them aloud.

It's a sad day for the Resurrection Parish, for Irena's family, friends, and neighbours. Yet, there is also a profound lightness and peace in the heart because reflecting on Irena's life reveals the essence of Faith, Hope, and Love in everyday life.

Together with Toronto parishioners, I pray for Irena's peace in the presence of the Lord. I thank her for her extraordinary and steadfast friendship and for her Christian witness. It's a joy to remember her among a circle of other saintly women.

Pope Francis Elevates Archbishop Francis Leo to the College of Cardinals

On December 7, 2024, Pope Francis presided at a Consistory to elevate 21 Catholic bishops to

the College of Cardinals. Among them was the Most Rev. Frank Leo, Metropolitan Archbishop of Toronto.

Makrickas was inducted into the College of



Cardinals by Pope Francis in Vatican City on Saturday evening. The Consistory of the College of Cardinals took place in St. Peter's Basilica, during which Pope Francis inducted a total of 21 clergymen into the College.

Archbishop R. Makrickas has become the fifth cardinal in Lithuania's history and is a cardinal elector—he will be able to vote in a conclave to elect a pope and could even be elected himself. At 52 years old, R. Makrickas is the fifth youngest cardinal in history.

The title of cardinal has also been granted in the past to Jurgis Radvila, Vincentas Sladkevicius, Audrys Juozas Backis, and Sigitas Tamkevicius SJ.



The newly appointed Cardinal Rolandas Makrickas, when asked about his emotions after the public consistory, told Lithuanian journalists that he was experiencing a special moment. "I am living through a unique moment

because the appointments of cardinals and the subsequent celebration, receiving the title from the hands of the Pope, are truly special. It is a spiritual moment—we see how the Church is renewing itself, how changes are happening that should lead to good. Today's liturgy and my thoughts are very hopeful; at the same time, the renewed College of Cardinals can do much for the Church and the world," he said.


