In today's Gospel Jesus is being questioned and tested by the Jewish authorities, yet the scribe who addresses Jesus seems to be an admirer; he is not testing Jesus.

The question posed in today's Gospel requires Jesus to interpret the Law of Moses. The Mosaic Law consists of the Ten Commandments and many additional commandments, numbering into the hundreds. For a devout Jew, adherence to the Mosaic Law is an expression of faithfulness to God's covenant with Israel. The ranking of

these commandments was regularly debated among the teachers of the Law.

Jesus was not the only Jewish religious teacher to connect these two commandments, love of God and love of neighbour. Both of these commandments were central elements of the religious tradition that Jesus learned from his Jewish community. Indeed, these commandments continue to be central aspects of contemporary Jewish religious understanding. Jesus' response to his questioners proposed an integral connection between these two aspects of the Jewish Law. Love of God finds its expression in our love for our neighbour. Many believe, however, that this connection was heard in a new and fresh way when spoken by Jesus.

The scribe who questions Jesus in today's Gospel engages in a positive dialogue with Jesus. He agrees with Jesus' teaching that the commandments to love God and love neighbour stand above the commandment to offer worship and sacrifice in the Temple. With this dialogue, Jesus appears to close the debate with the Jewish authorities. Mark reports that no one dared to question Jesus further. (loyolapress.com)

Understandably, not everyone feels comfortable or safe returning to church at this time. Live streaming of Mass from our parish in Lithuanian will continue Sundays at 11, as will the streaming of English language Mass from St. Michael's Cathedral.

The Province of Ontario's regulation related to proof of vaccination that came into force on September 22, 2021, directly impacts parish hall rentals. IN MEMORIAM Rev. Kazimieras Kaknevicius

Passed away peacefully at the age of 95 on October 23rd, 2021.

Born in Cekaiciai, Lithuania, one of eleven children.

Following the second world war he immigrated to Canada with his brother Juozas. Once in Canada he settled in Toronto where he met his wife, Janina Vanagas. They raised three boys, Victor (Tracy), Rimas (Rymanta) and Linas (Cindi).

Sadly, Janina died of cancer at the young age of 49. One year later, at the age of 53, Kazimieras decided to devote the rest of his life to the service of God and travelled to Rome to study for the Priesthood. He was ordained in 1984 and returned to Canada where he served the parishes of Our Lady of Siluva, London; Church of the Resurrection, Toronto and Lithuanian Martyrs Church, Mississauga.

His last few years were lived at the Labdara Nursing Home in Toronto.

Rev. Kaknevicius (Senelis) will be dearly missed by his three sons, seven Grandchildren Chris (Lauren), Jessie (Kris) Steven (Meg), Daniel (Meredith), Tomas, Ariana, Aleksandras, as well as six Great Grandchildren, Taelyn, Sydney, Elsa, Caitlin, Violet and Joshua.

Also left behind are his many relatives in Lithuania who he visited with all his children and grandchildren.

Rev. Kazimieras Kaknevicius was buried on October 27th at St.John's cemetery, Anapilis.

Pope Francis: Love alone attracts and changes the human heart



Saint Paul reminds the Galatians – and us – that the centre of salvation and faith is the death and resurrection of the Lord, Pope Francis said at Wednesday's

The Pope warned that there are many people today "who still seek religious security rather than the living and true God, focusing on rituals and precepts instead of embracing God's love with their whole being."

Return to what is essential

So, he said, St Paul asks the Galatians "to return to what is essential, to the God who gives us life in Christ crucified." Pope Francis encourages us to "place ourselves in front of Christ crucified," including in Adoration of the Eucharist, when we feel we are losing the thread in our spiritual life.

This leads to a further step, he continued: When we meet Christ crucified, Jesus changes our hearts, which leads us to understand that "the Gospel is meant for everyone, not just for a privileged few." Thus, the Pope said, "the life of the community is regenerated" and through the Spirit, our lives as Christians are renewed, and we are able to continue "to engage in our spiritual battle."

Works of the flesh v. fruit of the Spirit

Here Saint Paul presents a dichotomy between the "works of the flesh" and the "fruit of the Spirit." Pope Francis explained that the works of the flesh are "behaviours that are contrary to the Spirit of God. St Paul does not intend to say that the flesh is evil in itself, but uses the term to indicate the condition of being turned in on oneself, "closing the door to the spirit" and reminding us that the things of the world grow old and pass away, "while the Spirit gives life."

Christians are called to live out our baptismal calling, which leads to the fruits of the Spirit: "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control." Pope Francis invited Christians to read Saint Paul and reflect on our own behaviour to see if we are bearing those fruits.

A challenge for our communities

"The Apostle's teaching poses quite a challenge for our communities, too," Pope Francis said. He explained, "the beauty of faith in Jesus Christ cannot be grasped on the basis of so many commandments or of a moral vision developed in many layers which can make us forget the original fruitfulness of love nourished by prayer from which peace and joyful witness flow."

Nor, he said, can "the life of the Spirit … be suffocated by a bureaucracy that prevents access to the grace of the Spirit, the initiator of conversion of the heart."

Proclaiming Christ crucified

Therefore, Pope Francis said in conclusion, "we have the huge responsibility of proclaiming Christ crucified and risen, enlivened by the breath of the Spirit of love. For it is this Love alone that possesses the power to attract and change the human heart."
