This Sunday, called Palm or Passion Sunday, is the first day of Holy Week. Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday are called the *Triduum* —three days that are the highlight of the Church year.

In Mark's Gospel, Jesus' passion and death are presented as the consequence of the tension between the Jewish authorities and Jesus that had been building throughout his public ministry. This tension reached its breaking point when Jesus drove the merchants and

breaking point when Jesus drove the merchants and moneychangers from the Temple. After this event, the chief priests and scribes began seeking a way to put Jesus to death, and yet, this is only the surface explanation for his death.

When Jesus to death, and yet, this is only the surface explanation for his death. When Jesus was arrested and brought before the Sanhedrin—the council of Jewish priests, scribes, and elders—he was charged with blasphemy, citing his threat to the Temple. When he was brought before Pilate, however, the religious authorities presented his crime as a political one, charging that Jesus claimed to be king of the Jews. Throughout this Gospel, Mark challenges the reader to consider the claim with which the Gospel begins: Jesus is the Son of God. Throughout this Gospel, Mark challenges the reader to consider the claim with which the Gospel begins: Jesus is the Son of God. When we read Mark's account of the passion, we begin to comprehend the deeper theological statement being made about Jesus' death. In Mark's telling of the passion narrative, Jesus understood his death to have been preordained, and he accepted this death in obedience to God's will. Jewish Scripture is quoted only once, but there are several references to the fulfillment of the Scriptures. Jesus understood his anointing in Bethany as an anticipation of his burial, and he announced that this story would be told together with the Gospel throughout the world. Jesus predicted his betrayal by Judas as well as Peter's denial. At his arrest, Jesus acknowledged that the preordained time had arrived. Jesus was both confident and silent before his accusers. After he was sentenced to death, Jesus did not speak again until his final cry from the cross. The bystanders misunderstood and believed that he was calling for Elijah. The Roman centurion, however, affirmed what Mark has presented throughout this Gospel: Jesus is the Son of God. Nowhere was this revealed more fully than in his death on the cross.

During Holy Week, we prayerfully remember the events of Jesus' passion and death. As we meditate on the cross, we ask again and anew what it means to make the statement of faith that Jesus, in his obedient suffering and dying, revealed himself to us as God's Son. (loyolapress.com) † R.R.

All registered participants will be personally notified by email of the exact time and date of their respective appointments.

• The fee for consular services, which is paid during consular mission, is 50% higher than usual.

• The consular fee can be paid by debit or credit card. We do not accept cash or personal checks; we apologize for this inconvenience.

• All additional information regarding the documents required for your appointment can be found at <u>https://ca.mfa.lt/ca/en/travel-and-residence/general-information/passport-of-the-republic-of-lithuania</u>

In order to maintain the safety, all visitors are required to arrive in groups no larger than two persons, wear face masks and maintain a distance of at least 2 meters throughout the duration of their visit to the Consular Mission. We appreciate your co-operation and understanding.



Pope at Audience: Mary near to those who die alone in pandemic



at the bedside of those who die alone without the comfort of their loved ones.

As the Church prepares to celebrate the Feast of the Annunciation on Thursday, Pope Francis reflected on the beauty of the maternal intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Speaking at the Wednesday General Audience, the Pope continued his catechesis on prayer, focusing on "prayer in communion with Mary."

He began by noting the centrality of Jesus in all forms of Christian prayer.

"Each prayer we raise to God is *through Christ, with Christ and in Christ* and is fulfilled thanks to His intercession," said the Pope, adding that Christ "is the only Redeemer: there are no co-redeemers with Christ."

Blessed is the fruit

Pope Francis went on to say that Christ's mediation for us with the Father gives meaning to other references which Christians turn to in prayer, "first among them being the Virgin Mary, the Mother of God."

"She occupies a privileged place in the lives of Christians," he said, "and therefore, in their prayer as well, because she is the Mother of Jesus."

The Holy Father recalled how the Eastern Churches describe her with the Greek term *Hodegetria*: "the one who shows the way" to her Son. He added that everything about Mary is "completely directed" toward Christ and is the "first disciple".

Pray for us sinners

Jesus, said the Pope, extended Mary's maternity to all members of the Church when He entrusted her to His beloved disciple who stood at the foot of the Cross.

"From that moment on, we have all been gathered under her mantle," he said.

Just as she stayed near her dying Son in his last moments, said Pope Francis, so she remains with those who are dying, as we pray in the Hail Mary.

"Mary is always present at the bedside of her children when they depart this world," he said. "If someone is alone and abandoned, she is there, near, as she was next to her Son when everyone else abandoned him."

Now and at the hour of our death

During the Covid-19 pandemic, as so many people die alone in hospital due to social restrictions, Mary accompanies those who are on their deathbed in solitude.

She is with those who die without the comfort of their loved ones, said the Pope, "with her maternal tenderness."

"Prayers said to her are not in vain," he added. "She hears our voices, even those that remain closed in our hearts".

Heart of a mother

Mary, concluded Pope Francis, always protects her children, defending us from danger, even when we lose our way or put our salvation in danger.

"Mary is there," he said, "praying for us, praying for those who do not pray. Because she is our Mother."



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
